

The Crown Cove Aquatic Center is a collaborative effort between California Department of Boating & Waterways, California State Parks and Southwestern Community College. The Aquatic Center provides a wide range of educational and recreational activities to the surrounding communities.

Fees: Credit classes follow the regular fee schedule of Southwestern College. Classes are offered as credit, non-credit and fee-funded. Credit classes are: Kayaking; Hawaiian Outrigger; Surfing; Sailing; Sand Volleyball; Canoeing. Non-Credit classes are free courses. Book and certification fees apply and are dependent on the selected course. Fee-funded class costs are determined by the number of students attending multiplied by the number of hours in the course. It varies, but it is generally very affordable.

Registration: Register for non-credit and fee-funded classes by calling the Crown Cove Aquatic Center at (619) 575-6176. Course descriptions, dates and times are posted in the Continuing Education Schedule of Classes and on the campus web site at www.swc.cc.ca.us under non-credit courses. Many of these classes are available to the general public regardless of the student's educational background.

The *Safety Afloat Program* provides emergency, first responder and EMT refresher classes for Safety Service personnel, Lifeguard Training, CPR for the professional rescuer, AED, oxygen administration, pediatric CPR & safety, Standard Workplace First Aid and CPR, Swift Water Rescue, as

well as Wilderness First Responder training for offshore cruising and boat racing enthusiasts.



The *American Heart Association Community Training Center* is the organization that provides certifications to students successfully completing authorized courses.

These courses are taught by qualified American Heart Association adjunct instructors affiliated with the Training Center. Crown Cove Aquatic Center processes over 5000 cards per year for more than 100 affiliated instructors. We also teach several hundred free classes per year, both on and off campus.

The *Leadership Training Program* offers aquatic leader and instructor training in sailing, kayaking, canoeing, surfing, Hawaiian outrigger, team building games and beach activities promoting boating and water safety programs. Leaders completing the program are able to bring groups for water sports activities at discounted prices.

The *Youth & Group Program* offers a variety of boating and beach activities for retreats, day camps, and customized group events servicing adult and youth organizations from San Diego, Orange and Riverside counties and beyond.



The *Marine Safety Service Program* provides an opportunity for students to learn about the lifeguard profession and receive introductory training. It includes opportunities for continuing education units for currently working lifeguards and in-service training for community agencies, such as city and state lifeguards, firefighters and first responders.

What is Business Administration ASAP?

ASAP stands for Adult Student Accelerated Program, a program which offers general education and transfer-level courses in a format designed for a working adult student population. It is a unique way of completing an Associate of Arts degree and then transferring to a four-year college or university. Students who work full-time or have family responsibilities often find it difficult to take more than one class per semester.

Through attending Business Administration ASAP's weekly evening class sessions, taking online courses from home, and attending eight Saturday conferences per semester you can enroll in 12 units (four courses) with minimal job interference and complete the requirements for graduation and transfer to a university in two years.

Business Administration ASAP is offered through Southwestern College to anyone 18 years or older or a high school graduate.
